

Town of Ferrisburgh  
Special Informational Meeting  
November 12, 2015

Steve Gutowski, chair of the Ferrisburgh Selectboard, introduced Alex MacLean of KSE Partners; Bryan Sanderson of Anbaric; Joseph Rossignoli, director of the Anbaric Vermont Green Line Project subsidiary; and Galen Guerrero-Murphy, Senior Project Manager at TRC

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the proposed Anbaric/National Grid 400 megawatt high voltage direct current electric transmission line called The Vermont Green Line. If approved, the 60-mile underwater and underground line would run through approximately seven miles of Ferrisburgh, beginning with landfall at Kingsland Bay and continuing under Sand Road, Little Chicago Road, Botsford Road, Tupper Crossing, and Route 7.

Discussion ensued about the project and the exact route outlined on the map displayed. This map will be posted on the website: [www.vermontgreenline.com](http://www.vermontgreenline.com). Also on view at the meeting was a cross section of the cable that will be used.

Joseph Rossignoli discussed the "benefits package" being offered to the town:  
\$900,000 per year for the life of the project to the State of Vermont Education Fund  
\$150,000 per year for 20 years in municipal taxes to the town of Ferrisburgh  
\$350,000 per year for 20 years to the town of Ferrisburgh to be appropriated at the town's discretion

Additional meetings with Anbaric/National Grid will be planned. See the town website for dates and times.
